This manuscript provides a strategic analysis of a set of divergent practices that counter prominent notions about the deployment and meaning of electronic communication. I locate instances where subjects use electronic media to resist popular understandings of cyberspace, computer-mediated communication, nation and community, presenting unexpected responses to the forces of globalization and predominant U.S. value systems. The populations in my study--speculative fiction writers, Thai women confronting gender stereotypes, Bangkok-based Thai gay men who use the internet for local activities, and Tamil Eelam supporters imagining a conventional nation-state through the use of digital tactics--contribute websites, conversations, and artifacts that employ English strategically, broadening and splintering the language to express their concerns. These subjects use language and technology to provide novel imaginings of sexualities, genders, and national membership, a process I describe as Creolization.
